We are very excited to start the second phase of our Technical Agricultural program with the introduction of large animals to our farm. We are now the proud owners of five female cows. Teching our students agricultural skills and also how to raise large and small animals is one of the goals of our program. With the addition of animals to our farm our students can hands on experiences now

with animals. The skills learned at school can now be transfered to their family farms. Four of our new cows are Brown/Jersey. The breed has been successfully raised at this altitude and will produce about 15 to 20 liters of milk per day. The milk can then be used in our school kitchen. One of our cows is going to have a calf in December and we hope it will be a female to increase our herd. The gestation period for

a cow is nine months, exactly like humans.
